Grammar: subject pronouns/the present tense of –er verbs/negative of indefinite articles/verb+infinitive

Vocabulaire: Family members/home and neighborhoods/telling your age

Grammar: The verb avoir in the present tense/possessive adjectives/irregular adjectives

Regular –er verbs in the present tense/etre (to be)/avoir (to have)

Definite and indefinite articles/possessive adjectives

Second Nine Weeks Grading Period

Chapitre 5

Vocabulaire: Foods/table settings/dining out in France and in the United States/ordering food/expressions of location/expressing ownership and relationship

Grammar: The verb aller (to go) in the present tense/aller + infinitive/contractions with à/de/the verb prendre

Chapitre 6

Vocabulaire: Foods/shopping for food/food preparation

Grammar: Verb faire (to do, to make) in the present tense/the partitive and the definite article/negative partitive/the verbs pouvoir (to be able, can) and vouloir (to wish, want) in the present tense.

Chapitre 7

Vocabulaire: Clothing/shopping for clothes/sizes and fit/colors/styles/mall shopping
Grammar: the verb mettre (to put on) in the present tense/comparative adjectives/the verbs voir (to see) and croire (to think, believe) in the present tense.

Grammar: Passé compose of verbs with irregular past participles/negative words and expressions/the passé compose with etre.
